HERE WE GO.....BACK TO SCHOOL, BACK TO WORK, BACK TO ROUTINE!

School Start-up

Schools are now up and running, and we extend a warm welcome to all students and teachers. Please become familiar with the school locations and speed limits. Be alert for children walking and slow down, even if you are not in a marked school zone. Be considerate of school bus drivers - they are carrying our most precious "cargo". Our college students have also arrived, therefore pedestrian traffic across the highway has increased dramatically.

Town Utility Bills

Your utility bills are mailed out at the beginning of each month. One month you will receive a minimum billing - \$52.30 for 9 cubic metres of water, sewer, garbage and recycling fees. The alternate month, an actual reading is taken and you will be billed the minimum for the previous month plus additional water used for the previous **two** months. If you live on the south side of 105th Avenue, your water metre will be read January-March-May-July-September-November. If you live on the north side of 105th Avenue, your metre will be read February-April-June-August-October-December. After the actual reading, you will be charged the minimum rate (for 9 cubic metres) plus \$1.70 per cubic metre over and above the minimum. If your bill is exceedingly high, check your toilet(s), faucets and outdoor taps for leaks.

Animals "Out of" Control

Respect your neighbors and take proper care of your pets. Your neighbors have a right to peace and quiet in their homes and to be able to walk the streets without being annoyed or frightened by out-of-control pets. Scoop the poop!

BLUE BAG RECYCLING PICK-UP SCHEDULE

September 9	Paper and Cardboard
September 16	Plastic and Tin
September 23	Paper and Cardboard
September 30	Plastic and Tin
October 7	Paper and Cardboard

Garbage is picked up Tuesday morning on the east side of Main Street and Wednesday morning on the west side. You are allowed up to five bags. Tags for additional bags may be purchased at the Town Office at \$.50 each. **Residential blue bag recycling** is picked up Thursdays - see the schedule at left. The **North Peace Regional Landfill** is open 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. Thursdays, the landfill is open 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 pm. Last load in 15 min. before closing. When doing your **fall yard-clean-up**, please be sure to trim trees and shrubs hanging over sidewalks,

streets and corners. These need to be removed to allow proper access for garbage pick-up, street cleaning, snow removal, emergency vehicles and traffic visibility.

Fall/Winter Activities

Fairview offers a huge range of activities for all age groups. There are service clubs, sports groups, volunteer opportunities and fitness facilities. Ice is being made in the Fairplex at the time of this writing - watch for forthcoming skating schedules. The Cummings Lake Trail is open year-round. Check out the Fairview College Fitness Centre.
