Infrastructure and Development

- Tender packages will soon be issued for the 102 Avenue East Extension Project.
- Harvest Lodge has begun welcoming residents back following extensive flood-related renovations.
- Recreation user fees for the Community Centre, Aquatic Centre, Arena, and sports fields will increase by 2% effective September 2026.
- Council increased the Arena Ice Plant upgrade budget from \$50,000 to \$78,000 to complete the project.
- Approximately 38 acres of former NWP hay land will be leased to HawkView Ag for agricultural research.
- Expedition Management Consulting was awarded the Community Facilities and Recreation Strategy, a joint project with the MD of Fairview. Public engagement opportunities will be announced throughout the 12-month project.

- School and playground zone signs will be updated to include operating times. Sign replacements will occur over the coming month.

School Zones: 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Playground Zones: 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

- Council is considering amendments to the Community Standards Bylaw to better address unsightly and hazardous vegetation and trees on private property.

- The Fairview Hospital CT Scanner has been officially approved, with completion anticipated by April 2027, marking the culmination of many years of community advocacy.

Capital Projects – Investing in Fairview's Future

Fairview invests \$2–3 million annually in roads, utilities, facilities, and equipment through its Capital Budget and Five-Year Capital Plan. In 2026, Council approved \$3.41 million in capital projects, including \$2 million for the Treated Water Reservoir Rehabilitation Project. The Town is receiving \$1.76 million in provincial and federal grant funding this year.
