



Council, Community and Department Highlights

June 16, 2026

Public Hearing: A Public Hearing was held regarding the Designated Manufactured Home Assessment Bylaw. Manufactured home owners and park owners attended to provide feedback. Council subsequently passed the bylaw, which takes effect January 1, 2028.

Harvest Lodge: The Mayor provided an update on the restoration efforts following winter flooding. Residents are expected to return later this summer.

RCMP Museum: Council continues to review options for the former RCMP Museum building on 103 Avenue.

Pickleball/Tennis Courts: Renovations have been completed and the courts are now open.

North Peace Regional Landfill: The Landfill has signed a Letter of Intent with Hoppy Power to explore energy generation opportunities.

Infrastructure and Community Projects:

- Nine proposals were received in response to the Community Facilities and Recreation Strategy RFP.
- Council awarded the 2026 Sidewalk Improvement Project to Raiders Site Services for \$232,49.
- Council awarded the Treated Water Reservoir Rehabilitation Project to AGS Mechanical Contractors for approximately \$2 million.

Council Meeting Schedule: Council will move to its summer meeting schedule. Regular meetings on July 7 and August 4 have been cancelled.

Understanding Your Town Services - Community Services Programs, Facilities and Partnerships

The 2026 Community Services operating budget is \$2,444,192 and supports a wide range of facilities, programs, and services that contribute to quality of life in Fairview. These include the Arena, Aquatic Centre, Community Centre, Theatre, Parks, Playgrounds, Cummings Lake Recreation Area, EEO Community Hall, Library, FCSS, community events, and the Community Guide, as well as support provided to the Golf Club, Curling Rink, Fine Arts Centre, and Museum. Community Services revenues have increased by approximately 39% between 2022 and 2025, while actual expenses increased by approximately 8% during the same period. The Town continues to work toward providing high-quality recreational and cultural opportunities while maintaining responsible financial stewardship.

Did You Know? The Town leases and operates the Fitness Centre and Theatre from the college, while the Aquatic Centre is owned and operated by the Town. The recently installed Disc Park is located on the college campus and is another example of the strong partnerships that continue to provide recreational opportunities for residents throughout the region.

Exciting News for Fairview Campus! Northern Lakes College is preparing to offer post-secondary education on campus starting September. Northern Lakes College is currently recruiting instructors and support staff for these programs.
