RCMP Quarterly Report: RCMP Sgt. Dave Illi presented the quarterly policing report for January to March 2026. Crime statistics continue to trend downward, with an overall 13% decrease in Criminal Code violations since 2022. Compared to the same quarter last year, Criminal Code offences decreased by 20%.

Recreation Centre Usage Continues to Grow: Community participation remains strong with Fitness Centre usage increased by nearly 7% during the first quarter and Aquatic Centre attendance increased by 9%. Thank you to everyone who continues to support our recreation facilities and programs.

Fairview FCSS: 149 tax returns were successfully completed through the annual Income Tax Program for eligible residents. 68% from the Town of Fairview, 19% from Clear Hills County, 8% from the MD of Fairview and 5% from surrounding areas.

Summer Events and Road Closures: Council approved several temporary road closures to support upcoming summer events. We look forward to another exciting summer season in Fairview.

Tax Recovery Agreements: Council approved Tax Recovery Agreements with two property owners which provide a three-year repayment plan for property tax arrears while keeping current taxes up to date.

Understanding Your Town Services - Public Works Department

The Town of Fairview's Public Works Department plays a vital role in maintaining essential infrastructure and services for residents every day. The 2026 Public Works expense budget is \$3,754,451, representing only a modest 3% increase over 2016 actual expenditures. During that same period, Public Works revenue increased by approximately 30%.

Public Works staff are responsible for:

- Roads, curbs, and sidewalks
- Water and sewer lines
- Storm water systems
- The lagoon and water treatment facility
- Snow removal and ice control

Did You Know? Fairview's drinking water comes from the Peace River. During the winter months, when sediment levels are lower, water is pumped from the river to fill three reservoirs. The pipeline that transports water from the Peace River to Fairview is approximately 24 kilometres long and requires powerful pumps to move the water uphill to town.
