WATER SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

The Town of Fairview is currently undertaking an important aeration maintenance project that involves using and reducing the water level on one of our water-holding cells. This project is crucial for the proper functioning of our water system.

As a result of switching to this water-holding cell, we have noticed a slight organic smell and taste in our water. However, we want to assure you that the Town of Fairview conducts daily rigorous testing to not only meet but exceed the water quality standards set by the provincial authorities. Therefore, our current water supply is completely safe for usage.

We understand that the aesthetically unpleasing smell is an unfortunate side effect that we will experience until the water level in the holding cell is sufficiently reduced to allow access to the areas that require maintenance. It is expected that the contractor will be able to commence the aeration maintenance near the beginning of October. Public Works will continue to mitigate this issue and strive to provide a noticeable change by the beginning or mid-month of October.

We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this may cause and greatly appreciate your patience while we diligently work to ensure that our water systems are properly managed and maintained.
