MUNICIPAL CENSUS - April 20 to May 8

The Town of Fairview will be conducting a Municipal Census from April 20 to May 8, 2009. Currently, our official population is 3,297 as determined by the 2006 Stats Canada census. Council believes that our population may be higher. This is very important because grants from both provincial and federal governments are based on per capita funding.

The Fairview Fire and Rescue Society has been engaged to conduct the census. They will be going door-to-door, evenings and weekends, from Monday, April 21 to Friday, May 8. Census takers will carry appropriate Town identification. They will ask for your name(s), civic address, gender and age category as at April 20, 2009. If you are not at home, a notice will be left on your door with instructions. Please follow-up on these.

We are endeavoring to conduct a very accurate population count. Participation and cooperation with the Census Takers may make a huge difference as to funding coming into Fairview. That means a higher quality of community life for all of us!

SPRING WOES

WHO YA GONNA CALL?

Water Line Break - 'Tis the Season

If you notice a water break, immediately call Public Works. They will determine the location of the break. If it is on your property, it is your responsibility. If it is on town property, it is the Town's responsibility.

Each Spring, as the ground warms up, it is inevitable that some water pipes will "spring" leaks. Public Works staff must then locate the leak and fix it. This may involve disruption in water service and some "coloured" water from your taps. Please be patient while the town operators repair these breaks. You will be contacted if your water is to be shut off. If you have discoloured water after a break, let it run until the water is clear. If you see evidence of a suspected water break, please call the Town Office.

Flooding

Snow melting off your property and causing flooding in your basement is the homeowner's responsibility. If water is running off the street and is causing flooding, call Public Works.

Sewage Backup

If you have a sewage backup, call a plumber. If it is determined the clog is on your property, it is your responsibility. If the clog is on town property (the street), call Public Works.

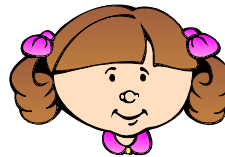
