ANNOYED BY NOISE?

Must we be governed, regulated and controlled when it comes to respecting our neighbors? The answer, judging by complaints coming in to the town office, is “yes”. For those who refuse to abide by the Golden Rule (Treat others the way you want to be treated.) we have **Bylaw 484, which prohibits certain activities creating noise, provides for the abatement of the incidence of noise and restricts hours when certain sounds may be made.**

The **General Prohibition forbids any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise whatsoever which either annoys, disturbs, injures, endangers or detracts from the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of persons within town.** What constitutes this type of noise is a question of fact for a court, but certainly the backyard party with loud music and offensive language is included here.

Motor Vehicle noises which are not reasonably necessary are prohibited. The operation of a vehicle any time of day or night in such a way as to unduly disturb the residents is prohibited. This includes quads, motorbikes and snowmobiles. A diesel tractor which pulls a trailer or semi-trailer truck may not run longer than 20 minutes while not in motion in any residential district or in any other location within five hundred feet of a residential district. These provisions do not apply to the Town of Fairview or a utility company.

Commercial and Industrial noises, such as loading/unloading merchandise, advertising by ringing bells, calling load and playing music, are prohibited between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00 am on a weekday and 11:00 pm and 9:00 am on a Sunday or Statutory Holiday.

Domestic noises, such as the operation of a lawnmower, snowblower etc. are not permitted between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00 am on a weekday and 11:00 pm and 9:00 am on a Sunday or Statutory Holiday. In addition to any penalty incurred by contravention of the Animal Control Bylaw, a person who has a dog(s) which by barking or howling disturbs persons in the vicinity of his home is guilty of an offence under the noise bylaw.

Construction noises, such as hammering, sawing and the use of mechanical or power tools are prohibited between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00 am of any day. This does not apply to necessary work carried out by the Town of Fairview.

Anyone who contravenes the noise bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction. Bylaw contravention may be dealt with by the Town’s Bylaw Control Officer or the RCMP. But must it come to that? Treat your friends and neighbors with courtesy and respect, and let common sense rule. It’s just the right thing to do.
