## PROPERTY TAXES

### **PROPERTY TAX ARREARS PENALTY**

**Per Municipal Government Act Section 326(c)** On January 1, 2018 all unpaid 2017 property taxes are deemed to be in arrears. A 15% penalty will be imposed on all property tax arrears in accordance with Bylaw 696/TAX/87. Payments may be made at your local bank, via telephone or internet banking, by mail or at the office by cash, cheque or debit. Alternatively, payment may also be dropped into the drop-box at the west entrance of the Provincial Building. If you have any concerns regarding your taxes please call the Town office at 780-835-5461

### **PRE-AUTHORIZED TAX INSTALLMENT PAYMENT PLAN**

Persons owning property in the Town of Fairview wishing to pay their current 2018 property taxes by monthly installments under the Town's Pre-authorized Tax Installment Payment Plan may do so by making arrangements at the Town Office by January 10, 2018. ## SNOW REMOVAL

Public Works provides snow removal services Monday to Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. In the event of major storms, snow control services will run 24/7 and may be supplemented by private sector equipment.

### *Ploughing Schedule in Order of Priority*

- 101, 103, 105 and 108 Avenues. These are considered our emergency routes.
- 102 Ave. between 109 and 111 St. Snow will be wind-rowed and removed immediately (due to the angle parking on the north side), after which Main Street will be wind-rowed. (Wednesdays)
- 100, 103, 106, 107, 108, 109, 111, 112, 115, 116 Streets - the hill roads
- 102, 104, 106, 107, 109 to 113 Avenues
- Residential areas: Beaver Ridge, Bickell Heights, Dunvegan Park, Burkholder Subdivision, North View Estates, Country View Estates and the remainder of the downtown area.

### *Snow Piling and Hauling*

Windrowed snow on Main Street, 103, 104 and 105 Avenues will be hauled after completion of the above priorities, along with 101 and 102 Streets. Wind-rowed snow on 102 Ave. between 109 and 111 St. will be hauled immediately due to the angle parking on one side. On residential streets, snow will be piled according to your house number. If you have an even number, snow will be piled to your side during an even year (2016). Likewise for odd house numbers in an odd numbered year. Time and budget permitting, snow piles will be hauled away from corners to increase visibility for motorists. In the event of a very large snowfall, snow may be piled on both sides of the street and the removal schedule will be at the discretion of the Director of Public Works or his designate
