The identification must show your name and address and can be: Canadian government photo ID; bank/credit card statement or personal cheque; correspondence issued by a school, college or university; government cheque or cheque stub; income/property tax assessment notice; insurance policy or coverage card; letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee; pension plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation; residential lease or mortgage statement; statement of government benefits; utility bill; vehicle ownership, registration or insurance certificate; or a letter or form (attestation) confirming that you live at the stated address.
