RESIDENTIAL WASTE PICK-UP NEW SCHEDULE BEGINS OCTOBER 1, 2008

Council of the Town of Fairview, at regular meeting held August 19, 2008, awarded the residential waste pick-up contract to Prairie Disposal Limited. Beginning October 1st, a new waste pick-up routine will be initiated. Bart Wisekal, Assistant Manager says "Prairie Disposal Ltd. is excited about our new working partnership with the Town of Fairview. We are looking forward to working with the residents of Fairview, and hope to improve on all your garbage collection needs." Mr. Wisekal has provided these important FAQs:

CHANGE PICK-UP DAY: West of 111th Street - Tuesdays, East of 111th Street - Wednesday

Is there a bag limit? Five bags (2' x 3') per household. If you have more, you must purchase "Bag Tags" at the Town Office for \$0.50 per bag. Only extra bags with tags will be picked up.

What containers are allowed? Garbage cans should be 100 liters or less with a secure, easily removed lid, fixed non-swiveling handles, and no wheels are preferred. Bags should be of tough strength and measure 2 ft. x 3 ft.

What can I put in the garbage? Regular bagged food waste, packaging, small household items, bundles or bagged yard/garden waste (tied branches must be under 4' long), rags, old clothes, broken dishes, broken glass (marked puncture-proof container), floor sweepings, sawdust. Please be sure to bag dusty materials. Keep weight to less than 20 kg (44 lbs).

Unacceptable items: Household hazardous waste (oven cleaners, paints, motor oil, pesticides, toilet cleaners, batteries, propane tanks, light bulbs, solvents, computer equipment, large items (mattresses, box springs, furniture, televisions, stereos, sofas etc), large appliances (fridges, stoves, freezers, dishwashers, hot water tanks etc), building/renovation material (wood with nails sticking out, drywall, carpeting, lumber etc), tree stumps/roots, manure, dirt or sod, tires, large metal auto parts. Never put needles and syringes in garbage bags. **What do I do with the above items?** Take them to an Eco Station, Landfill or contact Prairie Disposal at 780-539-5950 or the website at www.prairiedisposal.com

Where should I put my bags? On collection day, for front street collection place your garbage at the curb and park your vehicle in the driveway; for rear lane collection, place garbage within 3 metres (10') of the lane and ensure the cans are easily accessible. If there is construction in the lane, place your waste at the front curb.

Please help your garbage collector to stay safe. Every working day he picks up between 7000 to 11,000 kg of waste, the weight of 10 sub-compact cars. Keep the bag light (under 20 kg), package sharp objects in puncture proof containers, don't overfill the cans and put lids on securely. Please be extra careful and double bag vacuum cleaner dust, sawdust, pet feces and kitty litter. Don't stuff the can - the contents should come out easily. Keep your waste collection site clean and tidy year-round. In winter, clear away snow and ice. If your garbage is missed, call 780-539-5950.
