UTILITY BYLAW

Effective January 1, 2019 a new Utility Bylaw comes into effect. The changes from the old bylaw are outlined below:

- Utility accounts will only be created for the owner of the parcel of land, all existing utility accounts in good standing will remain until they are transferred back to the property owner
- Owners may have a copy of the bill sent to a second mailing address—paper copies will be levied \$2/month
- Overdue and unpaid utility bills will be added to the tax roll of the property
- \$1 monthly discount for paperless billing

There will be a increase in the sewer, garbage and recycling fees for 2019 as well. The increase for a single-unit residential will be \$3.74 per month.

Please remember that bylaws only allow parking a vehicle on the street for a maximum of 72 hours. Any vehicles parked longer than that are considered abandoned and may be towed. We don't like towing vehicles, please don't make us do it!

As well, snow bylaws state that sidewalks in residential areas must be shovelled within 48 hours of a snowfall and 24 hours in all other areas. Snow is considered removed when the sidewalk is reasonably bare from side to side (not just a path down the middle). Thanks for helping make our community safer for those that walk!
