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## BY-ELECTION - FEBRUARY 25, 2019

Due to the resignation of 2 Councillors, the Town of Fairview will be holding a by-election on February 25, 2019. Any candidates that wish to run for Council must have their nomination form filled out and brought into the Administration Office **between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 p.m. (noon) on January 28, 2019**. ## UTILITY BYLAW CHANGES

Effective January 1, 2019 a new Utility Bylaw comes into effect. The changes from the old bylaw are outlined below:

- **Utility accounts will only be created for the owner of the parcel of land, all existing utility accounts in good standing will remain until they are transferred back to the property owner**
- **Owners may have a copy of the bill sent to a second mailing address—paper copies will be levied \$2/month**
- **Overdue and unpaid utility bills will be added to the tax roll of the property**
- **\$1 monthly discount for paperless billing**

There will be an increase in the sewer, garbage, recycling and capital replacement fees for 2019 as well. The increase for a single-unit residential will be \$3.74 per month.

# SNOW REMOVAL



Public Works provides snow removal services Monday to Friday, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. In the event of major storms, snow control services will run 24/7 and may be supplemented by private sector equipment.

## Ploughing Schedule in Order of Priority:

- 101, 103, 105 and 108 Avenues. (Priority 1) These are considered our emergency routes.
- 100, 103, 106, 107, 108, 109, 111, 112, 115, 116 Streets—the hill roads
- 102, 104, 106, 107, and 109 to 113 Avenues
- 102 Avenue between 109 and 111 Streets. Snow will be wind-rowed, after which Main Street will be wind-rowed. (Wednesdays)
- Residential areas: Beaver Ridge, Bickel Heights, Dunvegan Park, Burkholder Subdivision, North View Estates, Country View Estates and the remainder of the downtown area.

## Snow Piling and Hauling

Windrowed snow on Main Street, 103, 104 and 105 Avenues will be hauled after completion of the above priorities, along with 100, 101 and 102 Streets. Wind-rowed snow on 102 Avenue between 109 and 111 Street will be hauled immediately due to the angle parking on one side. On residential streets, snow will be piled according to your house number. If you have an even number, snow will be piled to your side during an even year (2018). Likewise for odd house numbers in an odd numbered year. (The snow year runs from October 1 to May 30.) Time and budget permitting, snow piles will be hauled away from corners to increase visibility for motorists. In the event of a very large snowfall, snow may be piled on both sides of the street and the removal schedule will be at the discretion of the Director of Public Works or his designate. If it starts to snow more than 10 cm while removal is in progress, Public Works will start with Priority 1 again.
