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SNOW REMOVAL REMINDERS


Pursuant to Bylaw 937/TR/2009 Section 3, property owners are responsible to clear away all snow and ice from sidewalks that are adjacent to their property within 24 hours in commercial areas and within 48 hours in residential areas. Snow and ice must be removed from the entire width of the sidewalk. Absence of the owner from the property does not absolve the owner of the responsibility to keep the sidewalk clear. Where an owner fails to comply with this Bylaw, the Town may have the sidewalk cleared and any costs incurred will be invoiced to the owner. Failing payment, Council may charge the costs against the land as taxes. Failure to comply with this bylaw also constitutes an offense whereby the owner is also liable to a penalty of \$100 for each violation.

Pursuant to Bylaw 965/TR/2009 Section 19, any person placing snow on a roadway or onto another property that is not theirs is guilty of an offense. This offense carries a penalty of \$100 and the costs associated with the removal of the improperly placed material will be invoiced to the property owner where the snow originated.

Drivers and pedestrians are asked to use extreme caution around the large machines during snow removal. Do not drive under or close to the loader bucket. When machinery is backing up, please keep a safe distance. If you are too close, you are not visible in the mirrors. When meeting the grader, be certain you have eye contact with the operator before you pass or overtake it.

When hauling snow, it takes four minutes to fill a truck. Please be patient - when filling is complete the operators will make room for you to pass. After the grader has gone by, the loaders are generally 10 to 20 minutes behind the grader, depending on the amount of snow. We appreciate your patience.

RECYCLING & UTILITIES



Battery recycling is an activity that aims to reduce the number of batteries being disposed as solid waste. Batteries contain a number of heavy metals and toxic chemicals and disposing of them by the same process as regular trash contributes to soil contamination and water pollution, and have recently created a dangerous fire situation at our Regional Landfill.

Fairview has multiple avenues for battery recycling within the Town and at the Regional Landfill.

Commercial/automotive or larger batteries are extremely welcome at the Fairview Gymnastics club for donation recycling. This donation benefits our local club greatly! Drop off location for the Fairview Gymnastic Club is 9705 - 102 Ave.

Smaller batteries, D, AA, AAA's etc, can be dropped off in the recycling bins at the Provincial Building and Freson Bros. All forms of batteries are accepted at the Regional Landfill in their recycling containers NOT the general landfill cell.
