## RECYCLING & UTILITIES

**The grass bin will be removed for the winter on October 9, 2018.**

The North Peace Regional Landfill has brought to our attention that too much cardboard is still ending up in the Landfill. Please put cardboard in your blue carts or take it to the big blue bins in the alleys behind Main Street. There are bins behind Clear Body Image Spa, the Post Office, KFC, the Royal Canadian Legion, Hair Chic, The Mall on Main, and The Bargain Shop. There is also one in the parking lot to the west of the Provincial Building. The cardboard must be flattened to fit into the slots in the bins. Please respect the businesses and just use the Blue Bins for cardboard, do not put household garbage in their garbage bins. Household garbage goes in the black carts at your curb or beside them with the extra bag sticker on them. Purchase these stickers at the Town Office for \$1.05 each.

*Winter tip—Do not forget to turn off the water to your outside taps so they don't freeze and cause water leaks in the spring.*
