PROPERTY ASSESSMENT NOTICES

The Assessment Notices for the 2019 tax year were mailed out on Thursday February 7, 2019. Property Tax Notices will be mailed out in May. If you did not receive your assessment notice please call the Town Office and request your notice. All non-linear assessment complaints for the Town of Fairview, along with the applicable fees are due Tuesday April 16, 2019. An assessment complaint must be filled out using the Government of Alberta Assessment Review Board Complaint Form (LGS1402). This form can be provided to you by the Fairview Town Office or you can download it from the Municipal Affairs website at www.municipalaffairs.alberta.ca.

Assessments are based on market value as of July 1, 2018. You may appeal the assessed value of your property, but not the tax rate. For information about your assessment, please contact the Town's assessors: KCL Consulting Inc. online at www.kcl-consulting.com/inquiry-form/.
