

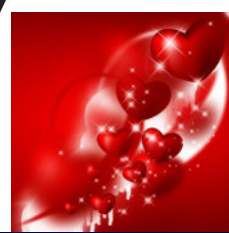

# PROPERTY ASSESSMENT NOTICES

Your Assessment Notices will be mailed out during February. Property Tax Notices will be mailed out in May. All non-linear assessment complaints for the Town of Fairview, along with the applicable fees are due within 60 days of mailing date. An assessment complaint must be filled out using the Government of Alberta Assessment Review Board Complaint Form (LGS1402). This form can be provided to you by the Fairview Town Office or you can download it from the Municipal Affairs website at [www.municipalaffairs.alberta.ca](http://www.municipalaffairs.alberta.ca). Assessments are based on market value as of July 1, 2019. You may appeal the assessed value of your property, but not the tax rate. ## SNOW REMOVAL REMINDER



The Community Standards bylaw (1047/GEN/2018) sets out standards for maintaining a clean sidewalk to allow safe pedestrian traffic. Section 5 of the bylaw indicates that "Snow and ice shall be considered removed when the Sidewalk is cleared for the entire width of the Sidewalk, down to the Sidewalk surface as completely as reasonably possible". The bylaw sets out a timeline of 48 hours for residential areas and 24 hours for all other areas and the timeline is measured from when the snowfall starts.

This includes removing any hard-packed snow using a snow/ice scraper if required. As well, if there is ice (or even snow) that cannot reasonably be removed, some type of melting product should be used to assist with removal or a traction aid, such as sand.

If you are a pedestrian and notice sidewalks that are difficult or impossible to walk on, please feel free to contact Enforcement Services at [by-law@fairview.ca](mailto:by-law@fairview.ca) or 780-835-5461.

The Municipal Government Act (MGA) and Enforcement and Penalties bylaw (1046/GEN/2018) allow clearing of the sidewalk by the Town, with all costs being paid by the property owner. Keeping clean sidewalks is important to ensure the safety of pedestrians in our community, many of whom are children or the elderly.
