### BATTERY RECYCLING

We all use batteries in powering many electronic devices that are in our homes or that we carry with us and use from day to day. Whether it be the small “button” batteries that power our wristwatches and hearing aids to the alkaline and nickel (1.5–9 v) batteries that we use in alarms to toys or the lithium ion (Li) batteries that power our cell phones and gardening/yard tools; all batteries have a life span and reach a point where they will no longer run our device or even hold a charge. At this point, many of us throw out the old, used battery and buy a replacement.

But did you realize that these used batteries are recyclable and can be remanufactured into many useful products or more batteries? Also these “dead” batteries are never completely drained of their energy and lithium batteries in particular, when broken or damaged in the garbage can cause a fire that can be become very difficult and expensive to extinguish.

So as a consumer of these products please do not throw them in the garbage, but place a piece of tape across the exposed terminals and place the batteries in a plastic container. When your container is full you can bring it to B&E Hardware in Hines Creek, in Fairview place it on the rack inside the door at Freson Bros., or bring it into the North Peace Regional Landfill and we will ship them off for recycling with Call2Recycle.
