



FAIRVIEW ARENA RE-ENTRY

Guidelines + Expectations for resuming Ice Activities

Please do not visit the Fairview Arena if you:

- Are showing symptoms of Covid-19 such as fever, runny nose, sore throat, or shortness of breath. Please consult Alberta Health for more advice/information
- Have travelled outside of Canada within the last 14 days
- Have been in contact with anyone sick with Covid-19 within the last 14 days

We have implemented safety measures that comply with Alberta Health Services Guidelines

- All staff and patrons are required to follow Provincial Health Guidelines
- Hand Sanitizer stations are available throughout the facility. Please utilize this when entering and exiting the facility
- Ensure physical distancing is always maintained
- While masks are not mandatory, they are strongly recommended when physical distancing is not possible

Arrival and Departure

- Please follow directional signage
- Access to and Exit from the Fairview Arena will be permitted through the front doors only, the doors on the East side of the building will be locked
- Ice users are not to arrive more than 10 minutes prior to scheduled ice time
- Ice users are required to leave within 15 minutes after completion of their scheduled activity
- Spectators will be allowed access to the arena 10 minutes prior to the scheduled activity start time and must proceed directly to the spectator area
- All spectators are required to remain in designated areas other than to access the washrooms located in the main lobby
- No Food or Drink is permitted in the Spectator areas at this time

Personal Protection

- Maximum number of participants on ice is 50 (including player boxes)
- Ice users are to refrain from spitting
- Ice Users should wash their hands frequently, before and after each practice
- Physical Distancing must be maintained within change rooms therefore only ice users will be permitted
- It is recommended that only those participating in activities access the facility

Players, Coaches, Participants and Spectators should be aware of the risks associated with the return of ice activities and take precautions. It is the responsibility of those participating to assess and manage the risk.
